The shipyard was famous for building the largest wooden sailing ships ever built! The Wyoming, built in 1909 at the ship yard, was the largest wooden ship ever built. Upon arriving at the museum, you will board a boat for a narrated cruise past Bath Iron Works where they build destroyers for the US Navy. In World War II, Bath Iron Works built more destroyers than the countries of Italy, Japan, and Germany combined! The cruise will tell you how the ships were made in the past and how they are made today. You will also get to see the Arleigh Burke and Zumwalt class destroyers in the water. After the cruise you will receive a guided tour of the museum and learn of the shipbuilding history of Bath. While at the museum be sure to visit the gift
